To My Fellow Alumni:



Class of '57**

**ACHIEVEMENT
IN A CHOSEN
PROFESSION**

After his graduation from MASH, Jay went off to Central Methodist University in Fayette, MO graduating with a BA, Major in Biology and Minor in Chemistry. He then went on to graduate school at the University of Missouri, studying wildlife management. After grad school, literally within months, he received his draft notice and eventually joined the US Air Force and was commissioned. He had no intention of making this a career, but he decided to stay in the Air Force for 23 great years, retiring with the rank of Colonel.

While in the Air Force, Jay held many positions including Avionics Inspector, 81st Avionics Maintenance Squadron Commander, Special Assistant to the Director of Logistics, Manager of Palace Logistics Maintenance Team, 51st Aircraft Generation Squadron Commander, Deputy Commander for Maintenance 62nd, Chief of the Aircraft Branch of the US Air Force at the Pentagon and finally the Director of the Aircraft Division, Ogden Air Logistics Center, Hill AFB in Utah. He also received his MBA, Business Management from the University of Arkansas in 1972 and in 1987 received a Distinguished Graduate Award from Central Methodist University.

Following his retirement from the service, Jay was given a fantastic opportunity with the Boeing Commercial Airplane Company in Seattle, Washington. He worked at Boeing from August 1986 until May of 1999. His first job was managing the design and construction of a classified vehicle. After a promotion he worked on the overhaul of the U.S. Air Force KC-135 aircraft and then became a Corporate Auditor

and worked on the factory rework study of Boeing Commercial Airplanes. Several promotions followed, including Manager of the Program Management Office for the 777 Division and Senior Manager of Flight Test Quality Assurance, which involved certification of the 777 airplane and planning for the certification of the Next Generation 737. He then was promoted to Senior Quality Factory Manager, 737/757 Programs which included final assembly, preflight and the commercial delivery center for all 737 and 757 airplanes. He finished working at Boeing as Senior Production Manager, Field Operations 737/757 Factory Manager for Quality Assurance. When he retired on May 1, 1999 they were rolling out a 737 every 16 hours. Jay worked as a consultant with the RAND Corporation from October 2001 until June 2003.

During his years in Seattle, Jay and his wife Julie became very interested in central Oregon, specifically Bend, buying a condo and eventually building a home. Bend provides Jay and Julie with a myriad of fantastic opportunities such as fly fishing, golfing, skiing, volunteer work and 300 days of sun a year. Jay serves as a guest lecturer at the Cascade Campus of Oregon State University. He has two children, Chris and Matt, who are both married and live in the Seattle area.

Stephen Mefferd has a successful record

of getting results by instilling good values and work ethics and by being the type of confident, committed and hard working individual that Mechanicsburg Area High School is known to produce. His love of education and academic excellence spans almost 40 years since his high school graduation. He is a 1969 graduate of Lebanon Valley College where he received a B.S. in biology and chemistry with postgraduate work in immunology, pharmacology and biochemistry. He is also a graduate of the Pennsylvania State University Food Chemistry Ice Cream Short Course and taught high school biology and chemistry. He was successful in developing a laboratory supplement which provided increased access to special education students for hands-on student involvement in science education enrichment.

Stephen worked for Bayer/Miles Laboratories as a sales and marketing manager and continued his technical business career with Johnson & Johnson / Ortho Pharmaceutical Corporation until 1996 when he became a co-founder of BioFX Laboratories. BioFX is a specialty immunochemical company that develops and manufactures chemicals that check for the presence of disease. One of the leading diagnostic tests for heart attacks uses BioFX chemistry to provide the patient status to the medical team. His products are used throughout the world and include chemical compounds that turn color, form dots or spots, or create a chemiluminescent glowing light reaction to test the environment, food and animals, and monitor our health. BioFX has become one of the world's leading suppliers of these specialty chemical compounds.

In 2005, Stephen co-founded BioAssay Works, a gold nanoparticle company that uses microscopic gold particles to make medical tests. The company has several very novel patents in the area of rapid, lateral-flow diagnostics. Their goal has been to create tests that are easy to use and can be carried and stored at the most advanced laboratories as well as the most remote places. Their technology has given fireman, policeman and first-responders to accidents or environmental spills the ability to detect and identify substances on the spot within minutes without any sophisticated laboratory equipment. One test they make is similar to a home use pregnancy test, but instead tests for the influenza virus, AIDS, or anthrax spores as well as other substances. In the event of a pandemic flu epidemic, they have a technology that could screen incoming arrivals at airports and border crossings worldwide to quickly identify infected individuals and reduce the rapid spread of disease. The company has recently introduced a technology that permits therapeutic monoclonal antibody developers to identify and monitor their most promising cell lines for future development in the emerging area of antibody therapy. The company goal is to create simple, easy-to-use diagnostic strips to monitor any disease or pollutant possible.

Stephen has earned a level of professional respect and admiration from colleagues, employees and investors alike for his fundamental belief that success is built with the contributions of many. He enjoys working collaboratively with others to achieve success while contributing a high level of energy, a focused sense of urgency, enthusiasm and humor to all projects.

Stephen lives in Virginia and has been married to Beverly White Mefferd since 1973. They have two sons, Andrew and Peter. His brother, Theodore Mefferd '58, a retired Methodist minister, lives in Mt. Gretna, PA and his sister, Bonnie Mefferd Schaefer '60, lives in Ohio, PA. Another sister, Trudie Mefferd Seagrist '62, nominated Stephen for this award.

SERVICE TO HUMANITY

As a member of the Mechanicsburg High School Class of 1955, her classmates can't remember a time when Linda wasn't on a committee or when she didn't become "the committee" with one other person because no one else was interested. Linda Mohler Humes is one of those dedicated individuals who keep voluntary non-profit organizations running and who enhance civic organizations with their organizational and financial expertise.

In the 1970's Linda served on the Mechanicsburg Visiting Nurses Association Board (VNA). The VNA provided excellent home health nursing care to community residents, and in 1989 became associated with Comfort Care of Holy Spirit Hospital. The assets, now worth \$272,920, were used to establish one of the first funds in the Mechanicsburg Area Foundation (MAF). Income is used to provide health and social services for residents of the Mechanicsburg area including free mammograms and diagnostic screenings. Linda now serves on MAF's Advisory Committee and is happy to see the income from that fund being distributed annually for charitable health care projects in the Mechanicsburg area.

Over the years Linda has been involved with the following community activities: Cumberland County Historical Society, Board of Directors, Program Committee Chair; Bethany Development Corporation, Board of Directors; Mechanicsburg Revitalization Task Force/Main Street Trust; Joseph T. Simpson Public Library, Board of Trustees, Past President, Past Treasurer; Cumberland County Library System, Board of Directors; The Advisory Committee of The Mechanicsburg Area Foundation; and the Mechanicsburg Museum Association.

Twenty years after working with the first Mechanicsburg Revitalization Task Force/Main Street Trust, people who recognize the town's potential have again stepped forward to take action. As chair of borough council's Community Development / Downtown Committee, Linda was able to facilitate the formation of Main Street Mechanicsburg. With IRS status as a 501(C)(3) non-profit organization, the group is off and running in pursuit of its goals.

Her civic service includes serving as a member of the Mechanicsburg Borough Council since 2003 and past chair of the Borough of Mechanicsburg Planning and Zoning Commission. As a member of Borough Council, Linda has served on the following committees: Community Development & Downtown, Chair; Loan Review, Chair; Ordinance-Administration Legislative, Chair; Finance; Public Communications; and the Recycling Committee.

The progress of the Joseph T. Simpson Public Library has probably been the most phenomenal endeavor with which Linda has been involved. When she joined the Board in 1982, it was located in the former Church of the Brethren at Simpson and Frederick Streets and 130,000 items were circulated annually. Today, in the renovated mid-nineteenth century grain warehouse on North Walnut Street, space has tripled and annual circulation is 500,000+, including CDs and DVDs as well as books. There are computers available for public use and annually 34,000+ people attend programs for everyone from toddlers to seniors.

Linda has two daughters: Elizabeth Appleby, MASH '83 and Katharine Querry, MASH '88. She is a graduate of Hood College and a life-long member of Trinity Lutheran Church. Her interests are local history, reading, traveling and birding.

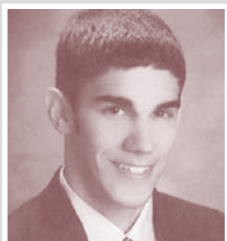

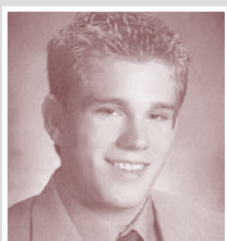

Wildcat Foundation

The Mission of The Wildcat Foundation is:

To enhance the quality of life for the students of the Mechanicsburg Area School District by expanding academic and cultural opportunities which may not be found in the traditional public educational environment

To expand and strengthen the educational mission of the School District which may not be funded by traditional economic resources

To provide for and enhance leisure learning, athletic and wellness programs for all residents of the School District

The concept of a foundation to enhance the academic and cultural experiences of children in the Mechanicsburg Area School District became a reality in 1998 with the creation of the Wildcat Foundation.

Since its inception, more than \$350,000 has been distributed to support and enhance programs affecting hundreds of children and their families.

In 2007, the requests for funds from the Foundation exceeded \$211,000 and approximately \$100,000 was made available from designated and undesignated funds to address these requests. Each year the positive impact on the lives of children becomes more and more significant. As a result, there are more and more requests for funds to support technology in the classrooms, academics, student wellness, cultural enrichment and awareness, and athletics.

In response to the increased requests for support received from school administrators, teachers, para-professionals, and community members, the Board of Directors of the Foundation has entered into a contract with Nancy C. Saidis & Associates, Inc. to conduct a feasibility study. The study is designed to determine the larger school community's willingness to support a capital campaign in the amount of three million dollars. The study will use personal interviews with approximately sixty individuals, and

completion of questionnaires by 500 to 600 community members and alumni. Numerous alumni, representing fifty years of graduates, have been identified to participate in the study. The feasibility study will help determine the likelihood of conducting a successful campaign, and the overall support for identified areas targeted for financial support.

Currently programs associated with the Trails and Trees Environment Center are also receiving significant support through generous contributions to the Educational Improvement Tax Credit

(EITC) Program. The Wildcat Foundation, a 501(c)(3) foundation, has been approved as a local education foundation eligible to receive contributions from businesses interested in receiving tax credits for their contributions. The tax credit is a 75% credit against taxes owed, and 90% with a two year written commitment of equal funding.

In 2006/2007 the total EITC funds received by the Wildcat Foundation amounted to \$36,667. Tax credits are awarded on a first come, first serve basis by the Department of Community & Economic Development. The first day new business applications can be received is July 2, 2007. DJ Bill Runkle, retired high school science teacher, served cotton candy and played tunes when the country rock band, Blackwater, was on break. Fire fighters and police officers from Upper Allen Township and Mechanicsburg displayed their vehicles and distributed free informational brochures. Members of the Wildcat Foundation served barbecued chicken dinners, barbecued pork sandwiches, pizza and soft drinks. The day ended with horse drop bingo and a breath taking view of the sunset.

The Wildcat Foundation uses the money raised at these two events to supply school organizations with grants for projects that benefit the students of the school district. During the past year, the Foundation has awarded more than \$40,000 to 23 district organizations. The VanGo! Project for elementary schools, the art and ancient history archeological dig site, the summer music master teachers, and PALS@MASH are just a few of the projects that the Wildcat Foundation has underwritten.
